Introduction

John 20:30–31 indicates that John arranged his Gospel around Jesus' signs.

And truly Jesus did many other signs in the presence of His disciples, which are not written in this book; but these [the eight signs] are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in His name.

He concentrates upon eight signs.

- Turning water into wine (John 2:1–12);
 Healing the nobleman's son (4:46–54);
 Healing a lame man (5:1–15);
 Feeding the 5000 (6:1–14);
 Walking on the water (6:15–21);
 Healing the man born blind (9:1–12);
- 7. Raising Lazarus (11:38–44);
- 8. Jesus' cross/resurrection (19–20; cf. 2:18–19).

The last and greatest of Jesus' signs was His cross/resurrection
1. John 2 identifies the cross/resurrection as a sign
2. John 19–20 treats the cross/resurrection as a sign
