Introduction

Review (Notes for messages 1-2 have greater detail than this review section):

- A. 1:1 and 18: The Readers of James Are Dispersed Jewish Believers (Brethren of James)
 - ... to the twelve tribes which are scattered abroad... (cf. Acts 8:1)
- B. 2:14ff: Addition model: Bike w/o rider. Similarly, unapplied faith goes nowhere.
- C. 1:19-20: The Thematic Statement and Outline of the Book:

Let every man be swift to hear,

slow to speak, slow to wrath (theme).

- D. Testing addition model on 1:21-27; 2:1-13, and 2:14-16 (the swift-to-hear section):
 - 1. Religious Devotion that Pleases God (1:21-27)
 - 1:22 But be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only. . . (ADD doing)
 - 2. Not Showing Improper Partiality (2:1-13)
 - 2:1 My brethren, have not the faith. . . with respect of persons. (+ doing)
 - 3. Applying Truths that (one who already is) a Christian Believes (2:14-26)

2:14 What doth it profit, my brethren, though a man say he hath faith, and have not works? Faith cannot <u>deliver</u> him, can it? (ADD doing)

New Exposition

Do ones who are already Christians need deliverance (2:14b) that requires faith plus works?

1¹⁸ Of his own will begat he <u>us</u> [James and his readers] with the word of truth, that

we should be a kind of firstfruits of his creatures.

¹⁹ Wherefore, <u>my beloved brethren</u>, let every man be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath. . .

Wherefore [you] lay apart all filthiness and superfluity of naughtiness, and [you] receive with meekness the engrafted word,

↓

which is able to save **your** [the brethrens'] souls.

Believers need for God's word implanted to deliver them

- 1^{21} Wherefore [<u>you</u>] lay apart all filthiness and superfluity of naughtiness, and [<u>you</u>] receive with meekness the <u>engrafted word</u>, which <u>is able to save **your** souls (*psuchē*).</u>
- 1. Note that James did not say that the word <u>saved their</u> souls.
- 2. Neither did he say that the word is able to save <u>the unbeliever's souls</u>, but that it is able to save these believers' souls.

Understanding "save the soul/life (psuchē)" (KJV NT often interchanges: = Strong's 5590).
 Look up the noun: "life/lives" in Strong's. See how often it is 5590 (italic) in NT.

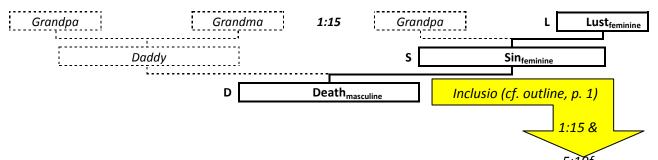
Acts 27¹⁰ And said unto them, Sirs, I perceive that this voyage will be with hurt and much damage, not only of the lading and ship, but also of our lives (psuchē).
Acts 27³⁷ We were in all in the ship two hundred threescore and sixteen (276) souls (psuchē).
Acts 27:43 ⁴³ But the centurion, willing to save Paul, kept them from their purpose. . .
Acts 27⁴⁴⁸ And so it came to pass, that they escaped all safe to land.

The kind of saving their souls/lives had was to escape unto the land; No one drowned.

(Reminder of Point) James 1:21 tells these believers that their souls/lives need deliverance.

1:14-15: The deadly power of sin in believers' lives.

1¹³ Let no man say when he is tempted, I am tempted of God: for God cannot be tempted with evil, neither tempteth he any man: ¹⁴ But every man is tempted, when he is drawn away of his own lust, and enticed. ¹⁵ Then when <u>lust_{fem} hath conceived</u>, <u>it bringeth forth sin</u>: and <u>sin_{fem}, when it is finished [mature]</u>, <u>bringeth forth death_{mas}</u>.



5:19-20 Restoring brethren to fellowship can postpone death (save a soul—psuchē—from death)

¹⁹ <u>Brethren</u>, if <u>any of you</u> do err from the truth, and one convert [*return*] him; ²⁰ Let him know, that he which converteth [*returns*] the sinner from the error of his way shall save a [sinning believer's] soul (*psuchē*) from death, and shall hide a multitude of sins.
