# Going AWOL from Grace Galatians at a Gallop (Message 2)

### **REVIEW**

Paul wrote Galatians in AD 49 to the south Galatian churches (located in Iconium, Lystra, and Derbe) where Paul had ministered in Acts 13–14. Paul has made one trip to Galatia and two trips to Jerusalem before writing Galatians. As we saw last time, this argues for the South Galatian theory and against the North Galatian theory. The most important implication is this: Acts 15 occurs after Paul wrote Galatians, not before.

Paul, a divinely appointed apostle, wishes grace & peace to the Galatians from the Father and the risen Son, who paid for our sins that He might remove us from this present evil age (Gal 1:1-4)

#### NEW EXPOSITION

1:6-7 Paul is shocked that the Galatians so quickly were departing from the grace gospel

Paul pioneered in Galatia from (October 48 to mid-summer 49). He wrote Galatians in late fall 49.

## 1:8-9 Paul proclaims (temporal) judgment from God upon those who pervert the gospel

The word translated accursed in the NKJ (verses 8–9) is anathema

The NIV erred severely by rendering it eternally condemned

Mark 14:71 Then he began to curse [anathematize] and swear, "I do not know this Man of whom you speak!"

Acts 23:12b some of the Jews banded together and bound [anathematized] themselves under an oath, saying that they would neither eat nor drink till they had killed Paul.

Acts 23:14b We have bound ourselves under a great oath [anathematized ourselves with an anathema] that we will eat nothing until we have killed Paul.

Acts 23:21b men who have bound themselves by an oath [anathematized themselves] that they will neither eat nor drink till they have killed him; & now they are ready, waiting for the promise from you.

Romans 9:3 For I could wish that I myself were accursed [anathema] from Christ for my brethren, my countrymen according to the flesh,

1 Cor 12:3 Therefore I make known to you that no one speaking by the Spirit of God calls Jesus accursed [anathema], and no one can say that Jesus is Lord except by the Holy Spirit.

1 Cor 16:22a If anyone does not love the Lord Jesus Christ, let him be accursed [anathema].

1:10 Paul is not a man-pleaser, but a God-pleaser [contrary to what the legalists charge]
