

Why did Jesus ask the question three times?

Phileo and agapao can have different emphases, but considerable overlap exists



John 20:15-17 does not mean that *phileō* is inferior to *agapaō*. Consider the following:

5:20 The Father (*phileō*) loves the Son

11:3, 36 Jesus loved (phileō) Lazarus

16:27 the Father loves (*phileō*) the Eleven, because the Eleven love (*phileō*) the Son

20:2 Jesus loved (*phileō*) John the apostle and in 19:26 He loved him (*agapaō*)
