Just before Jesus ascended, His disciples asked, "Lord, will You at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?" (Acts 1:6)
He answered, "It is not for you to know times or seasons which the Father has put in His own authority." (Acts 1:7) Three Interpretations offered for Acts 1:7 1. God has no further plans for Israel (non-Dispensationalists' views)
 Someday, God will restore Israel, but this is of no concern to the disciples (the common Dispensational view)
3. Another Dispensational Answer:
The importance of the words "Times" and "Seasons" in Acts 1:7
The Disciples would receive power when the Spirit comes and they would be witnesses in Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, and to the end of the earth (1:8)

Jesus then ascended and angels promised that He would return in like manner (1:9-12)
